

Road To Recovery - Free Rides to Treatment For Cancer Patients

Our free program that matches trained volunteer drivers to cancer patients for ride assistance to doctor appointments and medical treatments. Call us at **1-800-227-2345** to schedule a ride or to inquire about how to become a volunteer driver!

Airfare

Limited free assistance is available for intrastate and continental US travel for cancer treatment for patients not covered by insurances. Call us at **1-800-227-2345** to schedule a flight. *With most partners, transportation assistance requires 4 business days advance notice. Limit of 6 one-way intrastate and 2 one-way interstate flights per patient per year*

Lodging In and Outside of Alaska

Our Alaska office works with local and national hotel partners to offer free and discounted lodging options during treatment. Contact our local office at **907-277-8610** for more information on discounts.

For care outside of Alaska, our 30+ American Cancer Society Hope Lodge® communities across the country provide a free place to stay during treatment so people with cancer can focus on getting better. These communities provide comfortable guest suites with private baths, as well as inviting spaces with all the comforts of home, including a communal kitchen, dining area, laundry rooms, and places to gather or find a quiet respite – all at no cost to guests.
